

Christos Anastasiou

Christos Anastasiou was born in Athens in 1974. He is a graduate of the Department of History and Archeology of the University of Athens. He completed his postgraduate studies in the field of Modern and Contemporary Greek History at the same department in 2001-2003. In 2012, he was awarded a Ph.D. at the University of Athens, focusing on the regulation of economic relations between Greece and the Great Powers in the period 1926-1928, the normalization of the political situation and the economic stabilization as a consequence of international agreements.

He is working at the "Konstantinos G. Karamanlis" Foundation in Filothei since 2002 and has been the Head of the Historical Archive since 2009 until today. From this post he has been responsible for the classification and documentation of most of the archives belonging to the Foundation, while he has supervised the digitization of the archives of Konstantinos Karamanlis, Panagis, Konstantinos and Lina Tsaldaris, as well as the Kanellopoulos collection in order to promote them and make access easier for the relevant public.

From 2015 he is a member of the War Museum's Board of Directors. From this position, in addition to his administrative duties, he has represented the Museum in various scientific events, while he is responsible for the documentation and digitization of Napoleon Zervas archive.

His articles and research interests concern issues of diplomatic, economic and social history. In this context, he is currently dealing with the writing of a monograph on the political philosophy of K. Karamanlis and its imprint on his economic and social policy.
