

## **Nikolaos Anastasopoulos**

Nikolaos Anastasopoulos was born in Athens and is a PhD of Modern Greek History of the University of Ioannina. Today, he is an Assistant Professor of Modern and Modern Greek History at the Department of History and Archeology of the University of Ioannina. His was a scholar of the «Herakleitos» Program scholarships for PhD research from the Ministry of Education of Greece and the European Union. He conducted archival research at the: a) “Universite Libre de Bruxelles” (ULB) in Belgium, b) Institute of Byzantine and Post-Byzantine Studies of Venice and c) University of Vienna (Institut für Byzantinistik und Neogräzistik). He participated a) in the research program of the European Union Interreg II "Greece - Italy", for Grecia Salentina and b) in the archival research for the creation of the exhibition “From the Infinite Country to the Great Epirus. Epirot following the overseas migration to the USA. End of the 19th century until the Interwar period” in Castle of Ioannina. He was scientifically responsible for the creation of the Center for Culture, "Archontiko Petralia" (Divri, Ancient Olympia). Since 2016 he has been a member of the Administrative Council of the Epirus Studies Society. His main publications include the monographs: a) Delinquent behavior and repression in Greece during the interwar period: The example of Prefecture of Ioannina (Ioannina: Epirus Studies Society), Ioannina 2012 (2 v.), b) The Israeli Association of Ioannina during the interbellum. Foundation, Aims, Presence (Ioannina: Josef & Ester Gani Foundation), Ioannina 2015, c) The Robbery in the Greek State (mid 19th - early 20th century), Publications ESTIA, Athens 2018.
