

## **Emmanuella Doussis**

Emmanuella Doussis is Associate professor at the NKUA, director of the section on International and European studies of the Department of Political Science and Public Administration and UNESCO chairholder on climate diplomacy. Since 2015, she has been the coordinator of the Athens EU Summer School on Moving the EU forward and the Athens EU model, a simulation of European institutions.

She studied political science and law at the Universities of Athens and at the Sorbonne in Paris. After a first Master's in international law, she completed a second one in Environmental Law. She completed her studies with a phd in international law. She has been visiting professor at the Universities of Bourgogne, Grenoble and Aix-en-Provence, and visiting fellow at the University of Geneva and the EUI (European University Institute in Florence). She is a member of the ILA Committee on the role of international law in sustainable management of natural resources and the Greek National Committee for Adaptation on Climate Change. She has published five books, and numerous articles in peer-review international journals (*Yearbook of International Environmental Law*, *Revue Générale de droit international public*, *Annuaire du droit de la mer*, etc.). Her more recent publications include "Does International Environmental Law Matter in Sustainable Development?", *Yearbook of International Environmental Law*, 2017; *Climate Change*, 2017 (Athens : Papadopoulos); and "Nuances de gris : les conditionnalités du FMI et les droits de l'homme » in: C. Titi (ed.), *Droit international économique et droits de l'homme*, Bruylant :Bruxelles, 2019. Her research interests include sustainable development law and policy, international law and peaceful settlement of disputes, international institutions and climate diplomacy, including the EU climate diplomacy.
